An update from the Director



Dear Friends and Supporters,

Mercy Brown Bag ended the calendar year in a whirlwind, and we have much to report. Our deepest gratitude and thanks to those of you who have worked by our side this past quarter to:

- Launch our Chapman expansion project, that will enable us to take on building pallets of food for the mobile grocery AND gives us 20% added capacity!
- Implement a recyclable bag project that saves 5,000 brown bags from landfills every month, and \$1500 from our budgets that can be used to instead purchase needed food!
- Pass our single audit in September for FY24 with zero issues noted.
- Establish new corporate relationships with Clorox, Amazon and Target, who all helped with the holiday box packaging and administering, and Costco, who is donating food recovered from their new Pleasanton store
- In the final months of 2024 we staffed the Brown Bag Advisory Council with 6 diverse, eminent members of the East Bay community providing us with strategic advice and counsel. Thank you to these important new stakeholders!

Unfortunately, the need continues to grow in our community. Another landmark was passed in December when we passed 10,000 unique individuals served. Your support and help is more critical and needed than ever. Thank you for all you do!
